Introduction

The Canterbury Tales has used first-person point of view in the General Prologue; the narrator of this poem is Chaucer, he speaks from his own perspective on the events of the story and the pilgrims who tell the tales. The author emphasizes details about each pilgrim that expose the characters' personalities and in particular their flaws. The tales themselves uses third-person omniscient point of view, beginning with a "once-upon-a-time". The pilgrims in The Canterbury Tales started their journey together in south London, the pilgrimage travel roughly for seventy miles.

The Tales takes place in the late 14th century and depicts a time of social upheaval, which includes the decline of chivalry, , rising criticism of the Church and the emergence of the middle class. Chaucer reflects the new social structure by depicting pilgrims of many different classes. Chaucer's portrayal of most of the religious figures as hypocrites also points to a rising swell of dissatisfaction with corruption and abuse in the Catholic Church.
