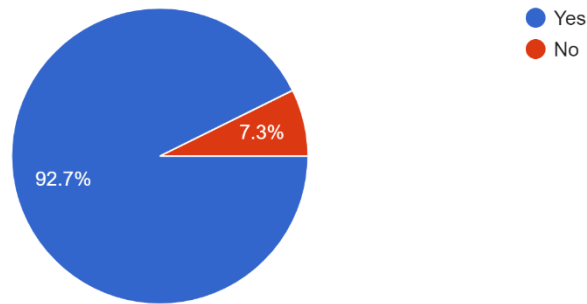

Sampling Techniques: Techniques used in this study is simple random sampling method.

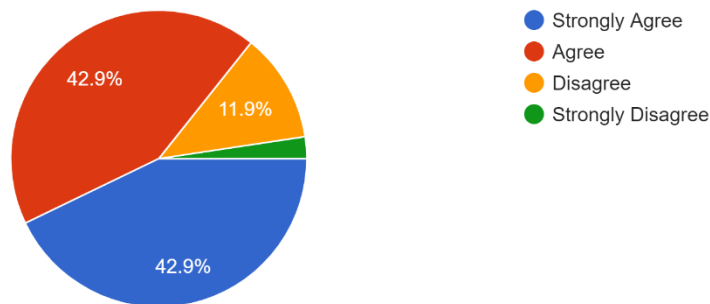
Data Analysis and Interpretations

1. In 19 centuries Ethical values been mandatory in education system



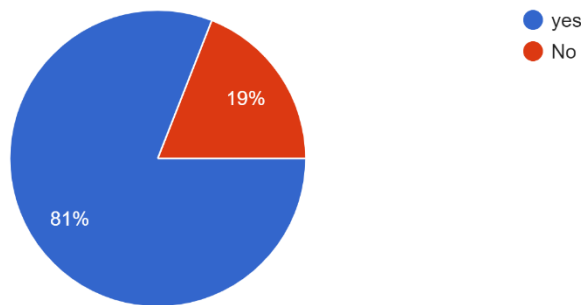

2. Does ethical values followed in 19 centuries were better than 20s centuries?



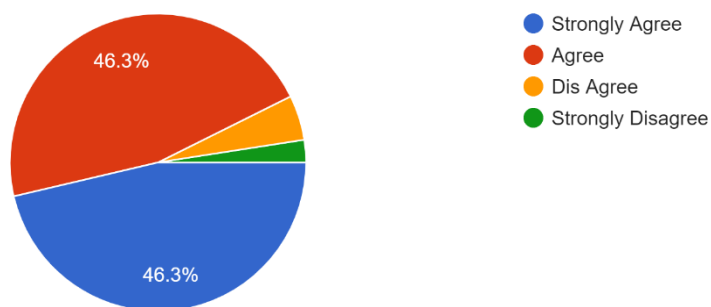

3. Because of people lived in joint family in 19th century safeguarded ethical values



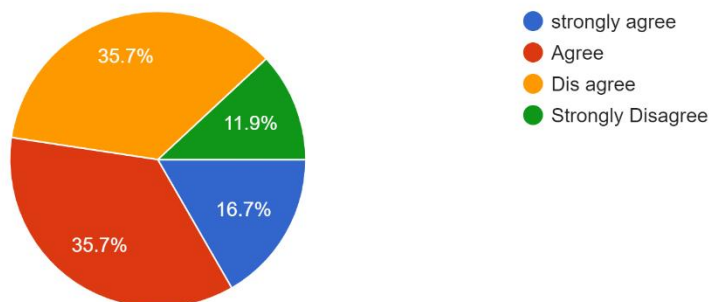

4. Do you believe that ethical values has changed as changes happening in the economy?



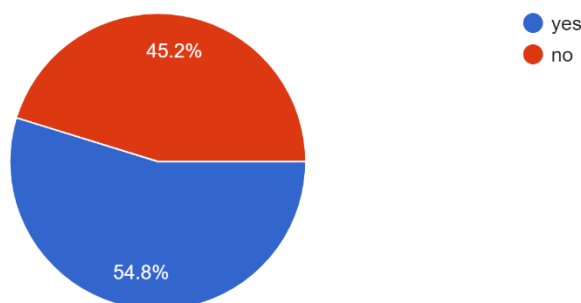

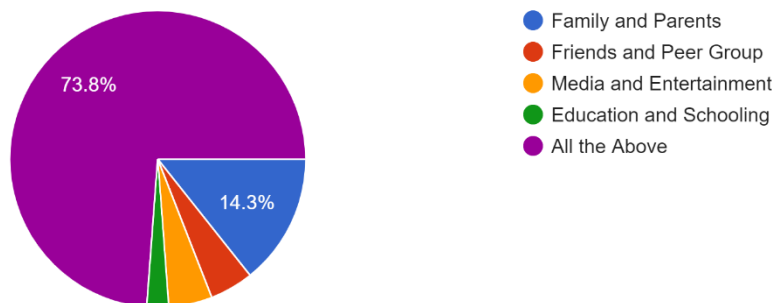
6. Ethical values been replaced by Status is what been perceived. Do you think its true perception?

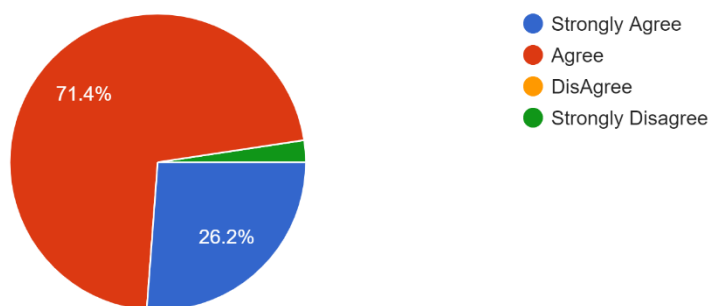

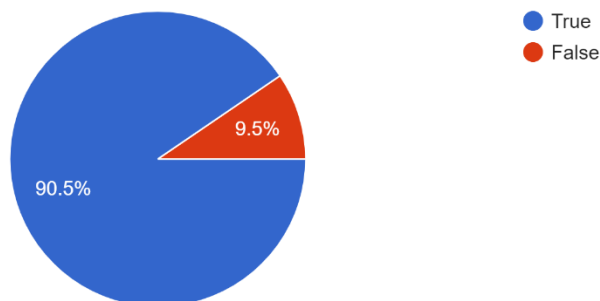
8. In today's generation education majorly focused on knowledge sharing than wisdom sharing

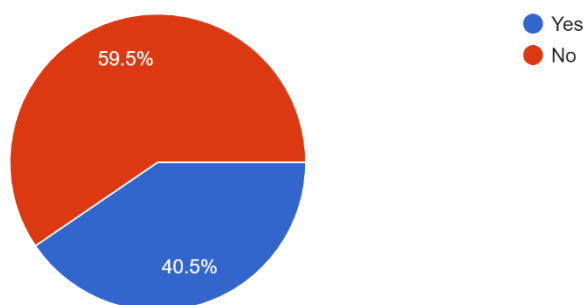
knowledge. Wisdom should be the foundation for making decisions so that we can avoid long-term negative effects.

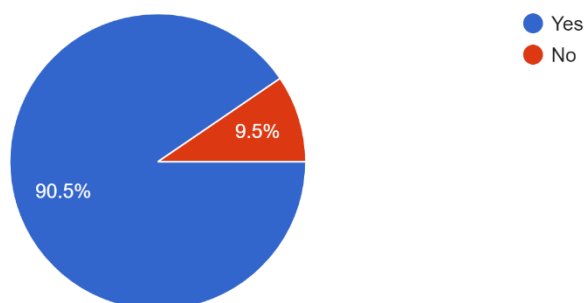
10. Introducing ethical values in education creates boredom to students ?

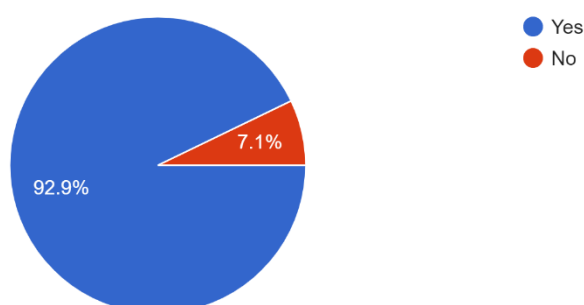

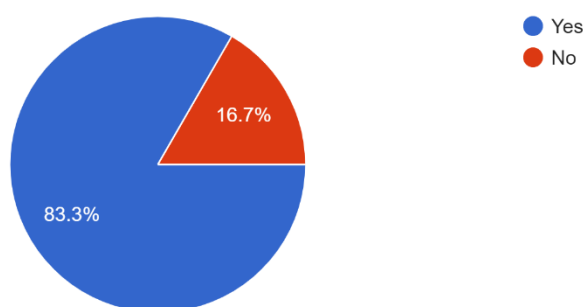
12. Do you believe that schools should have formal programs to teach ethics and ethical decision-making to students?



Interpretation: Such programs can help students develop an understanding of moral and ethical issues and the ability to make responsible decisions. It can also help students understand the consequences of their

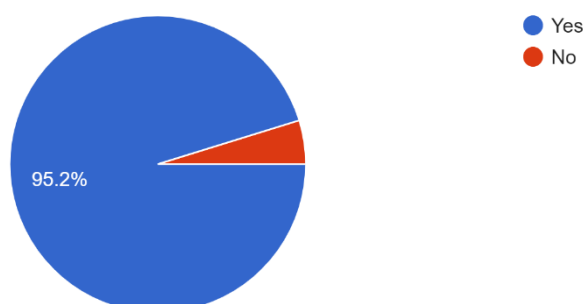

13. Do you think students' ethical values may change as they progress through their educational journey and into adulthood



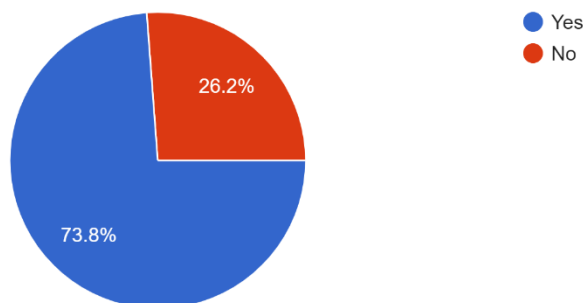

14. Social Media focused more on entertainment than values to the youngsters



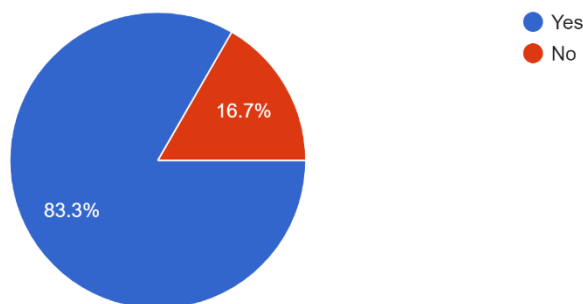

15. Do you believe that youngsters' ethical values may change as they grow older?



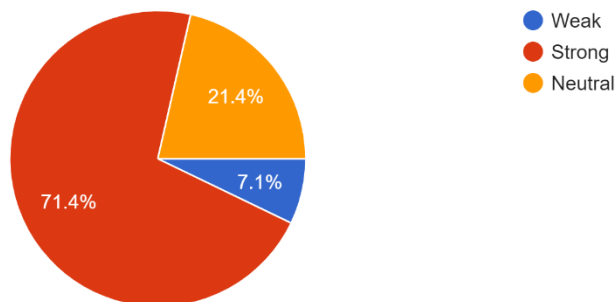

16. Redesigning Education curriculum will bring back ethical values back to youngsters



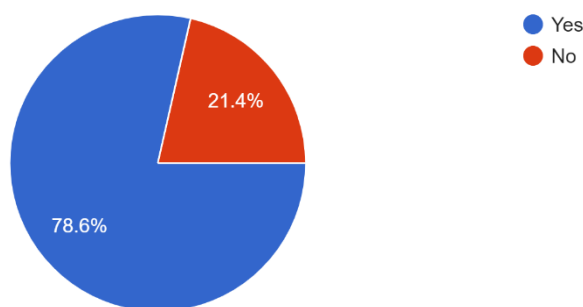

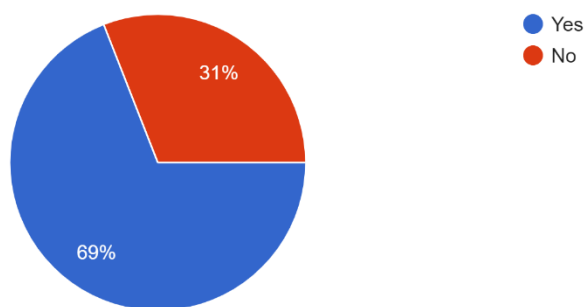

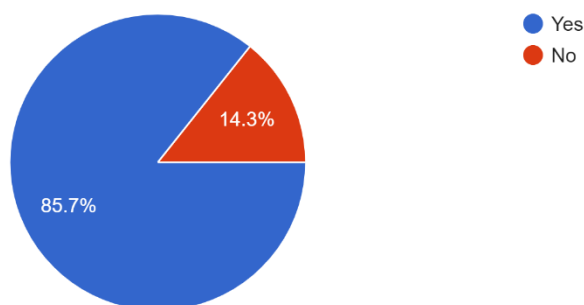
18. Robotics life makes each individual to be emotional less
