METHODOLOGY:




OVERALL CURRICULUM FEEDBACK BSC NURSING STUDENTS REPORT

PBBSC NURSING OVERALL CURRICULUM FEEDBACK


- 1. The overall responses from I PBBSC nursing students, 31 % excellent, 2% very good, 20 % fair, 47 % poor
